FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT 2021

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Good Friday, while the other two meals on that day are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl, which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese, as well as throughout our nation and our world.

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia is launching a novena to St. Joseph this month during the year that Pope Francis has dedicated to meditating on the saintly foster father of Jesus and husband of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Beginning on March 19 and extending through November on the 19th of each month, everyone is invited to unite in a single petition of confident prayer to the Lord through the heavenly intercession of St. Joseph. I will be praying for our parish and all our families as we engage a post-COVID renewal moving forward.

The novena can be prayed in any setting, especially before or after Mass, but not as a part of the liturgy, at parish meetings, in the classroom, and in the family home.

A special archdiocesan prayer intention is included with the novena for each month. See the entire archdiocesan novena prepared by the Office for Divine Worship along with the Litany to St. Joseph. The following is a St. Joseph Prayer from that Litany which might present a great opportunity for our families and our parish in acknowledging the Year of St. Joseph.

O Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Foster Father of the Divine Child, you were entrusted as the protective guardian of the Holy Family in Nazareth. Give today this same protection to the family of the Church in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

We plan to place an icon of St. Joseph near the Shrine of Our Lady in the church for the Year of St. Joseph. In November, at the end of this special year, we will install the icon in the current Meeting Rooms 'A & B' and rename them the St. Joseph Meeting Rooms. Honoring the saints by designating rooms helps us all enhance the Catholic atmosphere of the parish facilities and provides opportunities for catechesis.

As an example, we installed the icons of SS. John Neuman and Katherine Drexel in the large meeting room in the Celebration Center some time ago. We refer to that space as 'The Saints Room.' These two saints were renown for building churches and schools in the Diocese of Philadelphia and throughout the United States. For various reasons these two saints are also emblematic of the contribution of immigrants, as well as racial and ethnic minorities, in the history of the Catholic Church in America.

Have you noticed the images of Saints, Blessed, and Venerable who are acknowledged in the Shrine Room? We intentionally focused on racial and ethnic diversity when selecting these saints. There may be more images installed in the future. Each has a 'QR' coded next to them which connects their story to their image. Technology here at St. Peter is being used to promote the Mission of our parish!

Contact us at office@saintpeterchurch.net The RCIA process is conducted both virtually and in-person utilizing the 'Google Classroom' technology. Google Classroom allows participants to work at a time convenient for them and to connect with the whole group on Sundays at 12:30 p.m.

Here at St. Peter, the RCIA accepts person 16 years of age or older anytime throughout the year and adapts to the needs of the individual. Persons who were never baptized, as well as persons baptized in a denomination other than Catholic, can be part of the RCIA. We also welcome Catholics who, after their Baptism, may not have received Holy Communion or Confirmation.

4th Sunday of Lent March 13 & 14, 2021



First Reading 2 Chronicles 36: 14 - 16, 19 - 23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!'

Responsorial: Psalm 137

R. Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you!

Second Reading

Brothers and sisters: God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ — by grace you have been saved —, raised us up with him, and seated us with him in the heavens in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in his kindness to us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God; it is not from works, so no one

may boast. For we are his handiwork, created in Christ Jesus for the good works that God has prepared in advance, that we should live in them.

Gospel John 3: 14 - 21

Jesus said to Nicodemus: "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.
