Pope St. John Paul II: A NEW EVANGELIZATION: "...new in ardor, new in methods, new in expression..."

Writing about the mission of the church eight years ago Pope Francis "...quotes from the Vatican II document, On the Mission Activity of the Church (Ad Gentes), saying that this is a challenge for all the baptized, "Since the people of God live in communities, especially in dioceses and parishes, and become somehow visible in them, it is up to these to witness Christ before the nations" (No. 37).

He points out that the Church is often accused of imposing... an assault on freedom. But he stresses that the mission of the Church is not to impose, but simply to propose. "It would be an error to impose something on the consciences of our brethren," he quotes Pope Paul VI as saying.

But to propose to their consciences the truth of the gospel and salvation in Jesus Christ, with complete clarity and with total respect for free options which it presents... is a tribute to freedom," he continues. But it is a testimony of life that illuminates the path, which brings people love and hope." From http://sundayex.catholic.org.hk/node/1515

What are the Media Ministry Components of St. Peter Parish Media Ministry?

For a decade and a half Sue Kenna has produced one of the finest parish bulletins in the Archdiocese. This staple of parish communication is available in both virtual and print versions. A weekly printed Sunday Bulletin is very helpful to folks who participate 'in person' at weekend liturgies.

By far the three great innovations of parish outreach and Media Ministry which emerged during the pandemic are the Stepping Stones email blasts, the 'QR' code access to music and virtual bulletin which includes the readings for weekend liturgy, and the more robust presentation of Live Stream via YouTube. Robin Burckhardt prepares the weekly Stepping Stones, Austin Flinn along with Ryan Morris update the 'QR" codes weekly, and Chris Perry along with Rachel Bowman produce the Livestream of Mass on the weekends. We hope you have appreciated the projection of liturgical music and prayer on the walls of the church and the 'QR' codes which make the music and scriptures available on your personal electronic devices.

By including flat screen monitors in the Narthex and the Celebration Center (pre-pandemic installations) we are able to expand 'on-site' participation, including reception of the Most Holy Eucharist, by persons in the buildings.

We more recently expanded to include special editions of Stepping Stones, such as the Moving Forward Increased Offertory Program. Social Media was crucial to our invitations to participate in Benediction from the rooftop, Eucharistic procession through the neighborhoods, and the special Mass after the January U.S. Capitol incident. Livestream of sacramental celebrations, devotions, and funerals can sometimes be accommodated, but are dependent on the availability of Chris and Rachel to operate the technology. With Ryan Morris on board as Director of Media Ministries we have expanded into the world of Social Media in a big way. Saint Peter Parish is present on the internet through our web page www.saintpeterchurch.net as well as, YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, and on various Podcast platforms.

Additional "Good News" we recently received includes the following: On April 1, 2021 The Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia approved a grant to St. Peter Media Ministry in the amount of \$2,000.

The Media Ministry has the mission of assisting with outreach by parish ministries and our associated ministries to inform and invite the parish and the wider community promoting the works of Christ and sharing the mission of our parish.

Catholic Faith Formation, the RCIA, parish meetings and Archdiocesan meetings via ZOOM, Google Meets, and other platforms have become a part of the way we will be a 21st Century parish as we 'Move Forward.' 'Moving Forward' will have the vision of a both/and not an either or strategy. Many activities, programs, and ministries - 'Moving Forward' - will continue with strong 'on site' presence. We have a new re-invigorated Alcoholics Anonymous group "Never Give Up" meeting weekly in the Bethany Rooms, the Prayer Shawl ministry has been meeting through the last months on site, as have the Boy Scouts, the Gethsemane Prayer Group, and the Saint Vincent de Paul Society.

'Moving Forward' we hope to see more small groups form on the model of *Christ Life*, *Reach More*, *Alpha for Catholics*, *That Man Is You*, *Walking with Purpose*, *The King's Men*, *Bible Studies*, and a plethora of other possible programs and ministries. Second Reading 1 John 2: 1 - 5a My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one. He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.

Gospel Reading Luke 24: 35 - 48 The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled?" And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them. He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."
