

Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez issued a statement April 20 following the verdict in the trial of Derek Chauvin, the former Minneapolis police officer convicted on all three counts related to the death of George Floyd May 25, 2020.

The anguish, grief, and fear that consumed our country last spring following the tragic and disturbing death of George Floyd was overwhelming. In the immediate aftermath, old wounds were ripped wide open as the mortal sin of racism cut through our communities.

As a people of faith, Catholics believe that every life holds value and should be treated with dignity. In the name of the people of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, I share in the continued pain and sadness felt by so many.

Almost a year later, former Minneapolis police officer Derek Chauvin's trial has ended. Today's verdict will usher in a wide variety of reactions. I entreat all people to treat each other with respect, charity, and good will as they process the news in their own way.

Regardless of individual points of view, it is imperative to remember that criminal justice is a matter for the courts alone. Ensuring social justice, on the other hand, is a common responsibility that we all share. While the trial has concluded, the struggle to eradicate hatred is ongoing. Our God challenges us to love our neighbors with open hearts and to see Christ's presence in them.

May God allow us to be open to more difficult conversations and hard work as we seek to achieve peace and unity. While those goals are challenging, it is not impossible to attain them.

I pray that the Holy Spirit stirs up a desire in our hearts to look for solutions to the problems we encounter. May God watch over us and strengthen our resolve to ensure that our nation remains indivisible with liberty and justice for all.

Moving Forward: Catholic Education of All Our Parish Children
The Preparation and Celebration of Sacraments

Congratulations to all! First Reception of Holy Communion took place for many of our parish children during the past two weekends. Most of the children were in the second grade of Catholic School or the second level of the Parish Religious Education Program (PREP). Some children with different experiences of faith formation were welcomed as we strive to extend a warm welcome to families with various circumstances.

There will be additional experiences of the First Reception of Communion in the coming weeks. Some families were quarantined this past weekend and so will gather with us in the near future. We keep all these families and their various experiences in our prayers.

Magnificent cooperation in celebration of sacraments with social distancing, masks, and all the protocols and guidelines we observe here, based on Archdiocesan requirements and CDC mandates. Throughout the past 'pandemic' year we have been encouraged by the willingness to accommodate the needs and concerns of specific families. The entire school community, parish community, and all faith leaders have been a great example of the charity, love, and genuine spirituality expected from the followers of Christ.

This Spring we fully implemented the Archdiocesan Policy which changed the celebration of Confirmation to the eighth grade. Fifty-four parish young adults, students registered with Pope John Paul II Catholic School or PREP, met Archbishop Nelson Perez on the day of their Confirmation. Among the many lessons learned was Archbishop's succinct reminder to 'Never doubt the power of the Holy Spirit to work in you, and through you, and despite you!"

Baptisms of infants and young children continue to be celebrated at times and on days most convenient for families and with COVID concerns in mind. Most baptisms are now celebrated with only one family present. Other celebrations are returning to more normal circumstances, again within guidelines and protocols, and these include weddings, confessions, and funerals. Of course we never stopped hearing confessions on Tuesdays and Saturdays even when public worship was suspended.

And we never stopped responding to requests for Anointing of the Sick. Many hospice medical staff were very comfortable calling and trusted our adherence to protocols. Skilled care facilities, though cautious, likewise admitted the pastor as long as gowns, gloves, and face masks were worn.

We can't praise our teachers, catechists, volunteers, and administrators in Catholic School and PREP enough for their competence, ingenuity, skill, and perseverance. Both virtual learning and in person learning have continued and all our parish children are the beneficiaries. You are appreciated and we thank you!

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is flourishing at St. Peter Church. We use a Google Meets format as we continue the process on Sunday afternoons from about 12:30 p.m. until 2 p.m. Flexibility is the key and the materials are available online to candidates and catechumens to read at their leisure. 


