




The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) issued new guidance on the use of face coverings and masks on Thursday, May 13, 2021. People who are fully vaccinated against the virus *no longer need to wear masks or follow social-distancing guidelines in most indoor and outdoor settings,* except as required by state and local laws or other regulations, according to the guidance. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania automatically adopted the relaxed measures on Thursday.

Therefore, churches and institutions of the Archdiocese in Bucks, Chester, Delaware, and Montgomery Counties can freely comply with the relaxed measures with regard to face coverings/masks for the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. People no longer need to wear face coverings/masks in church nor follow any social distancing if fully vaccinated.

The May 13, 2021 guidance does not apply to capacity regulations currently in place.

The following is an addendum from our Parish Leadership Team:

The capacity regulations in place since June 6, 2020 allowed seating of 875 persons in St. Peter Church. Our average attendance never approaches that guideline. (No more than 350 persons typically gather for worship at any of our four weekend Masses.)

We trust that individuals and families will use their own good judgment as we move forward regarding seating and social distancing.

Almost all the candidates we have accompanied during my 18 years here at St. Peter heard about the RCIA process from family, friends, or other parishioners. They all come with a similar experience, namely, they found our parish to be hospitable and welcoming. This is really important and a great hopeful sign for us moving forward. Pentecost Sunday

May 22 & 23, 2021

First Reading Acts 2: 1 – 11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim. 


